

2022 NSYC Membership Costs

To be an active member of the North Shore Yacht Club you will likely incur these costs:

- Membership Dues. Member Categories and annual dues are described below
- Class Fees. Before being approved to use Club watercraft, you MAY be required to take class(es). See class fees below. All NSYC-owned watercraft users are required to pass a Skills, Swim & Safety Competency Assessment for each type of boat (sail, kayak, SUP) prior to use. Assessments are included in introductory classes. Classes begin in June and are subject to weather conditions. Class schedules are posted mid-spring and updated throughout the boating season.
- Parking Decal(s) for Park Ave. Boating Facility are available from the Park District. For details, costs and spring registration visit PDHP.org/boating. NSYC does NOT sell parking decals or rent storage spaces for private boats.

ALL members agree to follow NSYC Handbook Boating Rules and Equipment Use Rules, available at NorthShoreYachtClub.com, under "Member Forms & Docs." NSYC adheres to all current state and local health and safety guidelines.

Please allow 5-10 days from time of NSYC enrollment to get your parking decal, arrange for swim/skills assessments, sign up for classes and attend Orientation Sessions.

MEMBERSHIP CATEGORY	Cost
Full Membership: Privileges are for all household Members including dependent children under the age of 26 who live with the member. Full members may participate in any sailing, kayaking and SUP activities and have full use of NSYC owned recreational watercraft for which they have been assessed and approved.	\$325
Paddle Membership: Privileges are for all household Members including dependent children under the age of 26 who live with the member. Paddle members may participate in all paddling activities and have use of NSYC kayaks and SUPs for which they have been assessed and approved.	\$250
Power Boat/Outrigger Chicago Membership: For powerboat owners and members of Outrigger Chicago only. Includes all member privileges except the use of club sailboats, kayaks and SUPs.	\$185
Junior Membership: for Individuals ages 13-20; Members may participate in any sailing, kayaking, SUP activities and have full use of NSYC owned watercraft for which they have been approved, and in accordance with certain restrictions for minors. Junior members choose a term of membership identical to the term of all other classes of membership (Jan 1 to Dec 31) or, an academic year term from August 1 to July 31.	\$120
Reciprocal Member: Must be a member of another yacht club with paid dues greater than or equal to that of NSYC. List Home Club name (Dues for the home club plus dues for NSYC must equal a minimum of \$325 or the differential is to be added to NSYC dues).	\$185 +

Adult Sailing Lessons - Sat. or Sun. 9 AM - Noon, 7 Weeks, June - July Choose either Saturday or Sunday session, led by U.S. Sailing-certified leaders as well as NSYC volunteers. All sailing equipment is provided, except apparel and U.S.C.G. approved life jackets.
